### Storytimes

**Baby Lapsit** – Baby Lapsit is designed for babies from birth through 18 months. This short storytime lasts 15 minutes. Your baby will be on your lap throughout, and you will sing, move, & read with your baby! Tuesdays at 11 AM (Except 5/27).

**Toddler Time** – Toddler Time is designed for children in the 18mo to 3yo age group. This age group gets the wiggles, so there are lots of opportunities for movement and books that are appropriate for their attention span followed by playtime! Mondays & Thursdays at 10:30 AM (Except 5/26 & 5/29).

**Preschool Storytime** – Preschool storytime is designed for kids who are 4-5 years old! This storytime uses the five early literacy practices- sing, talk, read, write, and play. Each storytime features a letter, books that are a little longer and a little more complex to get us ready to sit in a classroom, and lots of fun rhymes and songs. After storytime, we play! Fridays at 10:30 AM (Except 5/30).

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**Special Elementary STEM w/ PBS Kids** – Join us May 5th at 4 PM for a special Elementary STEM w/ Brady from 10 PBS Kids! We'll learn about the different types of native bees in Idaho, do a pollination activity, and make a plant journal to observe a sunflower grow!
